

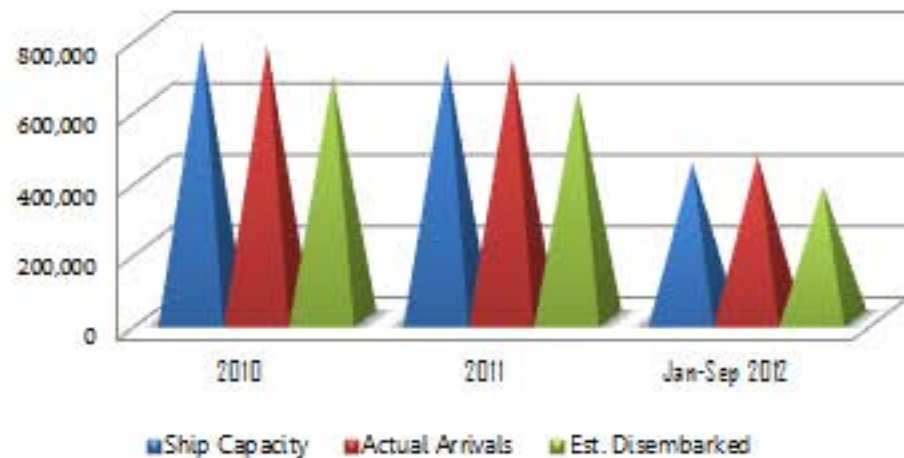

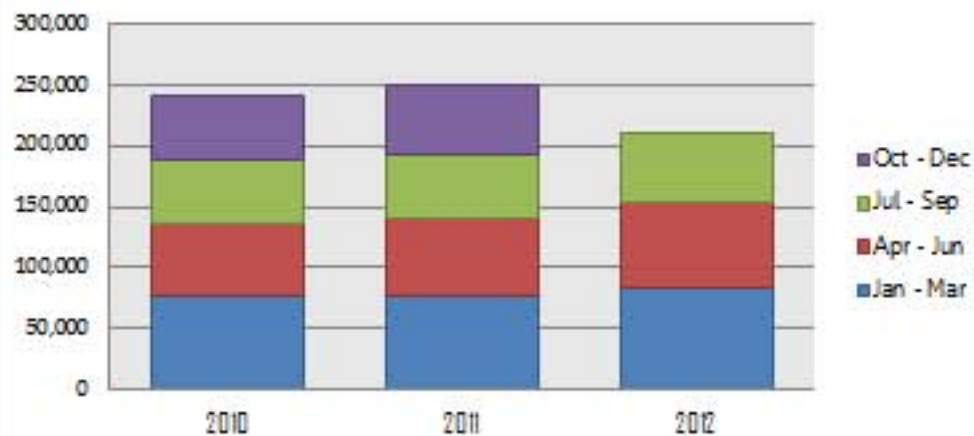

Cruise Arrival figures have been unpredictable in 2012 compared to the previous two years. Through the first quarter of 2012 there was a 7% increase in cruise arrivals. This was followed by a decrease of 23% in the second quarter, and a 19% decrease in the third quarter. There are fewer ships scheduled to visit Belize in 2012 than there were in 2011 and 2010. However, the number of scheduled cruise ship visits is set to increase again in 2013. The % disembarkation is an estimate based on recordings taken at the Fort Street Tourism Village. Estimates have consistently been around 88 - 90% disembarkation for Belize annually. Disembarkation is currently at 82% through the first three quarters of this year.

Cruise Arrivals: January - September 2012

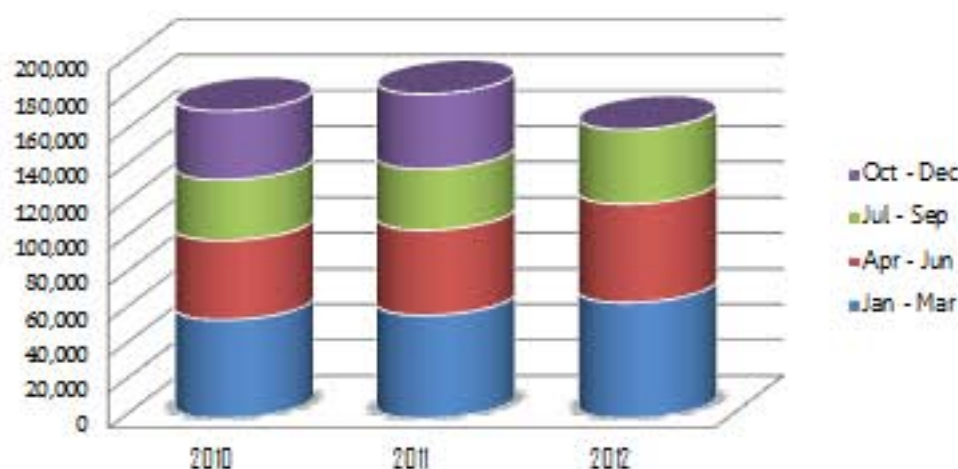
Total Overnight Arrivals By Quarter

2012 has been a record breaking year for Belize's overnight tourist arrivals through the first three quarters. In March 2012, overnight tourist arrivals exceeded 32,000 for the first time in history. January, May, June, July and September were all record highs for those particular months, and there have been no decreases in any month of 2012. We can expect more positive growth in overnight arrival numbers as the tourism high season approaches in mid-November.

Historically, visitors through the airport account for over 72% of tourist traffic into Belize. In April 2012 there was a 7.8% increase in airport tourist arrivals, which was the smallest percentage change for the year thus far. It was also the smallest numerical change for the year, with an increase of 1,299 tourists. The largest numerical increase occurred in June, with an increase of 3,365 tourists. The 30.2% increase in September represents the largest percentage increase for the year thus far. In each quarter of 2012, the percentage increase through the airport has been greater than that of the preceding quarter.

2012 has been a very good year for Belize's overnight tourist arrivals. Considering the historical trend of increases in the fourth quarter -high season, an annual projected increase of at least 9% in arrivals for 2012 is reasonable.

In 2013 tourism growth is expected to continue, but not at the accelerated pace that occurred in 2012. A 4.5% overall increase is expected in 2013, taking into account historical trends as well as economic factors in origin market countries. The overnight arrival forecast was made possible with data contributed by the Oxford Economics Company (Tourism Economics).

Overnight (Air) Tourist Arrivals by US region & state

Arrivals by air give a good indication of the overall pattern of inflows of Belize's tourist visitors. Visitors from the United States make up over 60% of overnight arrivals to Belize annually. Belize's tourism industry is eager to learn exactly where these visitors are coming from. Looking more closely at the air arrivals from the United States, it appears that most US visitors come from California and Texas, the West and Southwestern regions of the United States respectively. On the East coast, New York is the primary state of origin for visitors to Belize, as is Florida in the South. These findings should not come as a surprise, since it is widely thought that many of these large coastal US cities are home to many Belizean communities abroad. Therefore there are many cultural and social connections that have been established over the years between the US and Belize in these particular areas.

Collectively European visitors account for about 12% of all tourist visitors to Belize annually. Most European visitors who come to Belize by air, are from the United Kingdom (over 34%). France and Germany are also popular European countries-of-origin. European arrivals to Belize have experienced very little growth over the past two years since the global economic downturn. This may be because many European countries are still experiencing economic turmoil marked by rising unemployment rates.

Overnight (Air) Tourist Arrivals by Canadian Province

Canadian visitors to Belize account for about 8% of all tourists. Visitors by air come mainly from Ontario (over 37%), followed by Alberta (29%). British Columbia (18%) is also a noteworthy region of origin. It appears that the number of Canadian visitors is increasing in 2012, as Belize tries to tap into the Canadian market by expanding airlift capacity through seasonal flights.

Most overnight tourist visitors come to Belize from the United States, Europe, and Canada. However Belize also welcomes tourists from other regions of the world in smaller numbers; particularly visitors from Central America. Belize shares a land border with Mexico (North America) and Guatemala. Many visitors from these countries and the neighboring countries of Honduras and Salvador, pass frequently across Belize's land borders each day. Central American visitors make up over 80% of the tourists who come from areas outside of Belize's three major market regions.

Historically, over 77% of Belize's tourist visitors have been 'leisure' visitors. Many of these types of visitors come to Belize as couples or as families. The second largest group are persons who come to visit friends or relatives living in Belize. In the past, most of these individuals were Belizeans living abroad. However in recent times, many American retirees have settled in Belize. Their relatives and friends from abroad would come to visit them in Belize, thereby increasing the pool of persons classified as "VFRs".

Belize forms a bridge between Central America and the Caribbean.

Because of its strategic location, Belize is an ideal place for many business travelers throughout the region. Business travelers to Belize are usually associated with private enterprises, but there are a few who also visit the country on official government business.

American Airlines and Continental Airlines continue to be the most popular carriers for tourist visitors to Belize. It is worth noting however, that although the number of leisure travelers that each carries is comparable, American airlines carries more than twice as many business travelers as Continental airlines.

While Taca airlines carries far fewer leisure travelers than Continental Airlines, the number of business travelers each carries is about the same.

Average Length of Stay and Average Daily Expenditure by Major Tourist Category

The Statistical Institute of Belize conducts an exit survey of tourist visitors at the three main ports of entry in the country on behalf of the Belize Tourism Board and the Central Bank of Belize. The survey produces an overall profile of the tourist visitor; but the two most important pieces of data produced are the average visitor length of stay and the average daily expenditure.

Business visitors have the highest average daily expenditure because they tend to stay in more luxurious accommodations than regular visitors. Conversely however, business visitors have the shortest average length of stay at just over six nights.

Leisure visitors are the largest number of tourist visitors in Belize. Most stay in the country a little over one week.

Persons who come to visit friends and relatives stay the longest in the country, averaging over 8 nights in 2011. Conversely, VFRs spend the least amount of money on average, because they rarely stay in paid accommodations.

AIR ARRIVALS - MIST

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It appears that most of Belize's tourist visitors are between the ages of 25 - 34 and 45 - 54. Males have a slightly higher number of visits when comparing the two genders on a whole. More mature adults (ages 55 - 64) make up a larger percentage of the market in the first quarter of the year (19%). However that share begins to decrease to around 15% in the second quarter of the year.

Overnight (Air) Tourist Arrivals by destination stayed

Ambergris Caye and the Belize district are the two most popular destinations for air travelers. The Belize district is still considered the country's commercial capital, while San Pedro is the number one destination for conventional tourism (particularly because of the barrier reef and the marine reserve). In the first quarter, Ambergris Caye was the leading destination visited at over 30% of all visits. Belize District was number two with 25% of the total visits. In the second quarter, the Belize district accounted for over 30% of overall visits, while San Pedro was a little less than 30%. Historically San Pedro generates over 43% of total hotel revenue and has the most annual estimated tourism visits. The figure for the Belize district is close to San Pedro's figure because Belize City and Belize Rural have been combined into a single destination.
