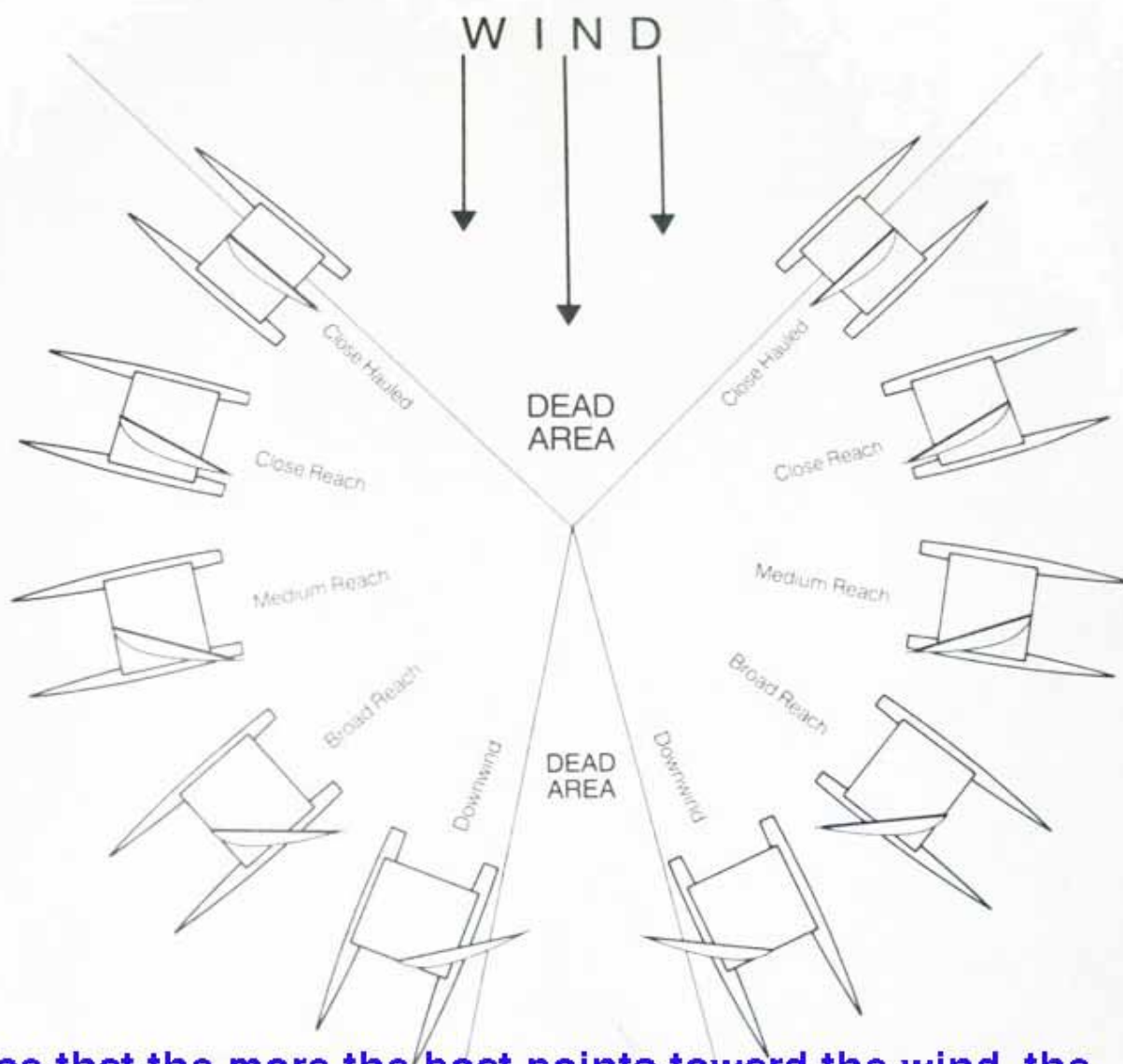

The Basics Of Sailing

THE SAILING CIRCLE

Wind Is The Key

The boats with the wind hitting their starboard (right) side are on starboard tack. The boats with the wind hitting their port (left) side are on port tack.



Notice that the more the boat points toward the wind, the more the sail is PULLED IN.(e.g. More Gas). Then, if the wind shifts toward the buoy, so will the course of the boat. If the wind shifts away from the buoy, there is nothing you can do about it. You are giving as much gas as possible.
