Aside from food, other expenses also come at cheaper prices. For fueling up a car, the gasoline is priced at about \$5 US dollars per gallon. Monthly water bills ranges from \$15-\$20 dollars and electricity is charged at about 15 cents per kilowatt hour for the first 50 kilowatts, and 20.5 cents on the succeeding.
