
ies that are home to our country's unique flora and fauna.

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

fecting after each use is always practiced.

Once on the way to the dive site, Venancio and Suyapa ensure that each diver has all their needed equipment. On the site, an in-depth briefing takes place, this time the adventure place is Hol Chan Marine Reserve; a 30 foot dive inside the reef but one of the most vibrant dive sites where the marine life is abundant and a true kaleidoscope of colors

Both dive masters are fantastic divers showing you the best of the marine underworld. For this dive we had the opportunity to see many Spotted Eagle Rays, green Moray Eels, Spotted Moray Eel, Southern Rays, Parrot fish, Damselfish, Snappers, Shrimp, among many, many other of big, small, colorful and less colorful creatures. Suyapa carries with her a fish guide card, with which she helps guests identify the variety of underwater creatures.

Once the dive is over, the able crew helps you get back on board. When drying off, a warm eucalyptus oil infused face towel, is handed to everyone to wipe the salt water from their faces. The warmth of the towel feels extremely good on your cold face. Served on a platter is an assortment of fruits such as pineapple and watermelon, such a delightful taste after a wonderful dive. Cold water to quench the thirst

is also served. Both dive masters take out their fish guides and start showing all those on board the different species of marine life we encountered below, before heading back for shore.

Ecologic Divers is a full service dive shop, not only offering trips to the various dive sites, but also caters for snorkelers and for those looking for full day snorkeling or mainland trips. Ecologic Divers is very family oriented and also offers a 7:30 a.m. dive. Enjoy the wonders of the world below and be back in time to enjoy breakfast with your family. Dive masters take with them an underwater digital camera with which they snap shots and later send it to the guest via email. "It's a little extra something for each guest who dives with us." They also offer guests the use of underwater digital still and video The beautiful underwater world at Hol Chan awaits you!

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# Red Fire Ants - Beware!

Ants are among the most numerous of all the insects. The Fire ant, (Solenopsis invicta) in particular is the most common specie in Belize and all parts of the world. It is considered the most aggressive. Found in most parts of Belize, there's no escaping these insects that roam the forest floors searching for food. There is a great diversity among ants and their behaviors. They range in size from two to about 25 millime-

ters (about 0.08 to 1 inch). Their color may vary, most are red or black, but other colors can also be seen.

Fire ants are symmetrical along the body, meaning that the left part is a mirror image of the right. They have hardened exoskeletons, meaning that they have no bones or internal supporting tissues, but tough protective layer for support and protection. They breathe through their trachea and their bodies can be classified into

three major parts: head, thorax and abdomen. They have three pairs of legs, and a pair of antennae that seems to be invisible to the naked eye attached to the head. Just like other ants, the worker and soldier ants are sterile females. The queen is responsible for laying thousands of eggs. The number of males is low, because only one male is needed for the entire reproduction process. Contrary to what most people believe, the fire ant does not just 'bite'. They use their jaws to anchor themselves and then, like a bee or wasp, inject venom using a sting at the tip of their abdomen. Using their strong mandibles to attach themselves to the victim's flesh, they can sting many times continuously.

Fire ants are one of the most successful groups of insects in the animal kingdom and are of particular interest because they are a social insect and form highly organized colonies or nests, sometimes consisting of millions of individuals. Colonies

work together and form super colonies, spanning a very wide area of land. Ant colonies are sometimes described as super organisms because they appear to operate as a single entity. They have colonized almost every landmass on Earth and can constitute up to 15% of the total animal biomass of a tropical rainforest. As of 2006, there are 11,844 known ant species, most of which reside in hot climates.

The lifespan of Fire ant workers depend on their size. Minor workers may live 30 to 60 days, media workers 60 to 90 days, major workers 90 selves to the victim's flesh, the red fire ants can sting many times coninternal fat stores and energy gained from the breakdown of her now useless flight muscles. of invasive ant species will sometimes to 180 days, and queens may live two to six years. Complete lifecycle from egg to adult takes between 22 and 38 days. The life cycle starts when the queen mates with a male. The sexual male and female workers have wings which allow new colonies to disperse. The sexuals (known as alates) fly into the air, sometimes as high as 100 feet (30 meter) in a large cloud and mate on the wing. After inseminating the female with sperm, the male dies. The female then searches for a suitable nest site, drops her wings and begins laying eggs. Until her first batch of workers (known as minums) are able to

Fire ants build characteristic mounds that are low and squat up to 40cm high and half to three quarters of a metre in diameter. The mounds are built in open areas, including lawns and pastures.

pae, the queen, and the colony. The workers also forge to find food for the colony. The Fire ant has two stomachs, one for its own food supply, and one for the colony's food supply. The second stomach is called a crop. They feed mostly on other insects but can attack small birds and other invertebrates. Flea larvae, chinch bugs, cockroach eggs, ticks, and other insects are also on their menu. They especially like to eat soft fruits, but the most fascinating thing about them is that they can carry food twenty times their body weight; truly fascinating.

The winged females go on mating flights and found new colonies. The male's only job is to mate with the queen. The ants migrate from one site to another quite often. A young queen only needs half a dozen ants and one day to build a new colony. Fire ants will build mounds in any type of soil. They also make mounds indoors. In three months, a new nest could contain over 300 workers; in a year, with multiple queens at work the nest will contain over 11,000 individuals. At the end of three years, a staggering 50 to 60 thousand ants will have built a multi-chamber mound about three feet high.

Ants are useful for clearing out insect pests and aerating the soil. On the other hand, they can become annoyances when they invade homes, yards, gardens and fields. Fire ants can cause

quite a problem. Fire ants interrupt farming production because they construct their colonies on precious farmland. They also like to make their mounds in sunny areas. Therefore, pastures are heavily infested. The control of these ants in pastures, hay fields, and recreational turf grass is at least a \$28 dollar per acre expense. Livestock and poultry can be injured and even killed by stings. Small birds such as baby quail are fair game to the expanding colony.

Farm machinery is often damaged by running over a mound. Fire ants can quickly strip fruit trees of their fruit. On a positive note, experts believe that they are essential to the tropical forest ecosystem as they turn the soil and redistribute nutrients. They also clean the ecosystems by removing small dead or dying creatures which hastens decomposition. Although small, they do have a powerful bite, so don't mess with them and watch your step!







It's a product locally seen and sold everywhere within the country of Belize. But, acclaimed Hot Mama's has now gone stateside.

Hot Mama's, is a Belizean company which produces sweet and spicy sauces and jellies, straight from Owner Wilana Oldham's home in the Cayo District.

Mrs. Oldham has been in the business of peppers for over a decade and in November of 2005, she was informed by the United States' Food and Drug Administration (FDA) that her product was approved for importation into the United States market. Yes, Hot Mama's met the safety and quality standards of the

But, how did Hot Mama's become such a highly praised commodity? In the early 1990's, Mrs. Oldham and her husband, Howard, turned their property into Pepperland Farm located in the Western Highway. The couple bought peppers from Belizean farmers, which they would then export to the U.S. In an interview with Mrs. Oldham, she commented that in one year Pepperland Farms managed to export ¼ million pounds of the "fiery stuff". The Oldhams continued their exportation business for the next seven years until 1996 when Mrs. Oldham got her hands on an old pepper jelly family recipe. With new energies, the couple decided to branch

After several attempts to re-make the family secret jelly, it never worked, because of an ingredient mix up. Mrs. Oldham explained that the recipe was not working because she had been using an old pectin which would not allow the product to gel. However, due to this slight mix-up, Mrs. Oldham stumbled on success - the Sweet Pepper Sauce.

Unfortunately, Mrs. Oldham fell ill in 1998, and therefore had to cease exportation to the US and abandon her jelly making kitchen. Once fully recovered, she returned to making her spicy sweet jellies, and with better spirits was able to produce the Manganero Sauce - a sweet and spicy combination of Mango and Habanero. This delicious combination became an instant hit and was soon the number one seller in the country.

Mrs. Oldham continued to experiment and soon created her own barbecue sauce. This sauce was made extra special since she used Belizean products such as molasses and Belikin beer. Soon enough, Mrs. Oldham had diversified enough to create her own hot sauces - Mild X, Hot XX and Fiery XXX.

Mrs. Oldham was pleased when her sauces were the most sought after accompaniment to a meal. "It was especially amazing to discover that even tourists had taken a liking to my sauces. It was great to have tourists email me wondering where they could purchase my products back home. That is when I knew that I had to start exporting my sauces.

In February of 2005, Mrs. Oldham began filling the paperwork for the FDA

which was submitted by July and approved in November. In 2006, Mrs. Oldham expects to develop her business by enlarging her kitchen/factory. She will also sit down with the farmers and speak to them about her intentions to expand. In addition, said Ms. Oldham, Belizeans can expect a new Hot Mama's sauce soon.

Hot Mama's has really branched out in the past few years - branched out to the extent of having not only specialty sauces but to having gourmet meats as well as honey out in the Belizean mar-

# San Pedro Street Treats

One of the features of life in tropical destinations like San Pedro and other parts of the Caribbean is the sale of in-season tropical fruits, vegetables, candy treats and home made pastries by road-side or street vendors.

Usually, they occupy a very small plot of place. In the corner of a street or in any strategic spot along the street where they usually offer special warm dishes, fresh fruits/vegetables, candy treats and much more. During the year, it is a common occurrence to see or spot these vendors making a living by providing us with the very best selection of their produce. Walking the streets of San Pedro, one can take a look at a variety of yummy treats that are on sale, but do we know most of what they are selling? The Sun, took it to the streets to visit the many local street vendors and find out about the yummy treats they offer. Here is what we found out!

# **Street Treats - Pepitos**

The Pepitos or locally known as "Macoby seeds" in Belize is a street treat that has long been a favorite. The shelled pumpkin seeds are often labeled pepitas, which means "little seeds" in Spanish. The pumpkin seeds are easy to make, fast and a tasty substitute for nuts. After you clean out and carve your pumpkins, what do you do with all the seeds inside? Well, most people would roast them, they taste so good that you are lucky if they last for more than one day! There are many different methods for roasting pumpkin seeds, but we will feature the Belizean style recipe; here is how to make them.

Gather these ingredients and follow the steps for your chance to make your own roasted pumpkin seeds for the whole family. Get a hold of some pumpkin or squash seeds, some olive oil or butter, salt or other seasoning. Wash the pumpkin seeds to remove all the pulp, and place in a bowl soaked in water and salt. Drain water and place on a baking sheet. Melt the butter in a pan and then pour, bit by bit, into the nuts, tossing while you go. The key is not to use too much butter, but just enough to lightly coat the seeds. Then, add salt to the nuts, just enough to taste. Preheat the oven to 250F and bake, turning occasionally, until crisp and lightly golden browned. Overcooking causes the nuts to toughen and lose flavor. Then enjoy! The delicious

roasted seeds are packed with protein, fiber, iron, copper, magnesium, manganese, and phosphorous, as well as the long as the outer shell is crunchy. The amino acids. They also contain some calcium, potassium, zinc, selenium, folate, and niacin. The pepitos seeds are sold in the shell, shelled, roasted, and raw. They can be found in stores and of course your local street stalls sold in

bags for just a dollar. The salty pepitos can be eaten whole without shelling, as crunchier the outer shell, the better the taste. # **Key Lime Cheesecake with Mango Ribbons**

If you can't find fresh Key limes, you can substitute bottled Key lime juice.

### Ingredients:

### For crust:

1 1/4 cups fine graham cracker crumbs 3 tablespoons sugar

1/2 stick (1/4 cup) unsalted butter, melted

### For filling:

2 (8-oz) packages cream cheese at room temperature

1 cup plus 2 tablespoons sugar 3/4 cup fresh Key lime juice (strained

from about 1 1/2 lb Key limes) or bottled

1/2 cup sour cream

1/2 teaspoon vanilla

 $2\ 1/2$  tablespoons all-purpose flour

1/4 teaspoon salt

3 large eggs

### For topping:

2 large firm-ripe mangoes

1 tablespoon fresh Key lime juice (strained) or bottled

1/2 cup chilled heavy cream

1 tablespoon sugar

### Preparation:

Make crust:

Preheat oven to 350°F and butter bot-



tom and side of springform pan.

Stir together crumbs, sugar, and butter in a bowl with a fork until combined well, then press evenly onto bottom and one-third up side of pan. Bake crust in middle of oven 8 minutes and cool in pan on a rack.

### Make filling:

Reduce oven temperature to 325°F. Beat cream cheese with an electric mixer at medium speed until fluffy, then beat in sugar. Add lime juice, sour

cream, and vanilla and beat until smooth. Mix in flour and salt at low speed, scraping down side as needed, until just incorporated, then add eggs all at once and mix just until incorporated

Pour filling into crust and set springform pan in a shallow baking pan. Bake cake in middle of oven until

set in center, 1 hour to 1 hour and 10 minutes. Cool completely in springform pan on rack. (Cake will continue to set as it cools.)

Run a thin knife around edge of cake and remove side of pan. If desired, transfer cake with a large metal spatula to a serving plate.

### Make topping:

Peel mangoes and, leaving fruit whole, slice very thinly lengthwise (slightly less than 1/8 inch thick). Halve wide slices lengthwise. Gently toss mango slices with lime juice.

Beat cream with sugar in a bowl with electric mixer until it just holds stiff peaks, then spread over top of cheesecake. Bending and curling mango slices, arrange them decoratively over cream.

### Note:

• Cheesecake (without topping) can be made 1 day ahead and chilled, covered. If desired, bring to room temperature. Add topping just before serving. Makes 8 to 10 servings.
