Bacalar Chico Marine Reserve and Park - Unspoiled, untouched, pure



Compared with other reserves in Belize, the terrestrial and marine reserve of Bacalar Chico has only just begun a legacy of conservation. The park officially opened August 23rd, 1996, after village leaders in Sarteneja began lobbying for a reserve in an area accessible to them and a site visit by New York Zoological Society and ITCF in 1991 established the conservation value

Bacalar Chico now comprises a 15,000-acre marine reserve and 12,000 acres

of terrestrial reserve and has been named a World Heritage Site by the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). It sits at the northern tip of Ambergris Caye overlooking the Bay of Chetumal and


Bacalar Chico covers 130 kilometers squared of pristine Belize Barrier Reef and Rocky and Robles Points - the only place on the mainland where the Barrier Reef touches the coastline. The beach front of the reef, including extensive mangrove lagoons, serves as the principal Belizean nesting area for Loggerhead and Green Turtles, breeding grounds for marine and coastal birds, and an indispensable nursery for many reef fish. The Bacalar Chico channel functions as the park's northern boundary and narrowly separates Belize from Mexico.

Bacalar Chico sits upon the limestone remains of coral reefs that once thrived in the area during times of higher sea level. Throughout the area, remnants of this reef foundation stick out, most notably at Rocky Point, where the old reef crest and back reef are exposed.

Aside from an abundance of wildlife, numerous Mayan sites lie within the area. During the height of the Mayan culture, the area served as an indispensable trans-shipment point. Merchants would paddle down from the heavily populated river valley cities inland en route to the sea beyond. Upon reaching the coast, people and goods would transfer to larger boats more seaworthy for the long trips ahead. An ancient sea wall clearly visible beneath the surface at the site of San Juan near the northwest corner of Ambergris Caye takes visitors back to a time when the beach bustled with activity. Thousands of pottery shards still litter the beach. Mayans dug out and cleared the area now known as the Bacalar Chico channel to avoid the long journey around the southern tip of the caye. The Belize Fisheries Department's ranger station is located amidst the ruins of Chac-balam, another important Maya trading center fifteen hundred years ago.



Boa Constrictor

Boa is the name of a group of snakes that vary greatly in size. The most common Boa is the Boa Constrictor. It inhabits American tropical regions from Mexico to Argentina. Two species, the rubber boas and rosy boas, live in the United States. The boa constrictor is a large, solitary snake that lives in rainforests, savannas, and semi-arid areas. It is a non-poisonous tropical snake belonging to a specialized group of reptiles — the first vertebrate class completely independent of water. It belongs to the same family as the python and anaconda and its life span is about 25 to 30 years. Known as "wowla" in Belize, they are found countrywide as well as on some of the offshore cayes. They will easily inhabit populated areas where rodents and songbirds are abundant. All species of Boas are either endangered or protected.

The Boa Constrictor's preferred habitat is rainforest, but it is also found in semi-arid savannah. Because its range covers such a large area, the Boa Constrictor varies considerably in color, marking, and size. They have coloration that camouflages them along with varying patterns of cream, brown, tan, gray or black ovals or diamonds. Their scaly skin glistens but is dry to the touch and their forked tongue senses odors. They have heat sensors under their upper lip that helps to locate warm-blooded prey and they have very large, curved teeth for grasping prey before constricting. Like all snakes, Boa Constrictors are cold-blooded; which means they are the same temperature as the environment. They continue to grow all their lives, getting bigger and bigger each year. Adult Boa Constrictors average about 6 to 10 feet long and weigh over 60 pounds. The largest Boa Constrictor ever found was 18.5 feet long. The Boa Constrictor is the largest snake in Belize, attaining a length of up to twelve feet. Boas live on the ground, in trees, or occasionally in underground burrows. In warmer areas, the boa constrictor is active throughout the year. However, in the cooler climates it may spend long periods of time inactive.

Boas are carnivores (meat-eaters) and mainly hunt at night. They primarily feed on birds, small mammals like monkeys, peccaries, and rodents and some reptiles including iguanas, young crocodilians and lizards. The Boa is a good swimmer and spends a lot of time near and in rivers It waits for any prey which may come near the water to drink and will lie still, attacking animals that pass by. The Boa kills its prey by constriction. Once it catches its victim, the snake wraps its body around the prey in coils, tightening its grip each time the victim breathes out. Eventually no longer able to breathe, the prey dies by suffocation or sometimes they drown the prey. The prey is swallowed whole and is digested with very strong acids in the snake's stomach. The Boa can swallow animals much larger than their heads because the bones of their jaws, throat, and body can stretch apart. Since the boa is cold-blooded and slow moving, it does not require a great amount of food. After eating large



Boas are beautifully camouflaged to mimic their natural surroundings, allowing

prey, such as a wild pig, the snake will not eat for a week or longer. Like other snakes, Boa Constrictors may live for many months without eating at all.

The Boa Constrictor has appendages resembling claws on each side of its genital opening. They are the remnants of the hind limbs inherited from the boa's lizard-like ancestors. The appendages are generally larger in males than females and are thought to be used by the male to stimulate the female to mate. After fertilization, the eggs remain in the female's body, where they develop over several months inside thin membranes. Unlike its close relative, the python, the boa constrictor gives birth to live, fully formed young. The

babies can be up to two feet long at birth and a large female may give birth to as many as sixty young at one time. The young Boa Constrictor begins feeding within a week or two after its birth and grows quickly, usually reaching a yard in length after several months. It is sexually mature at 2-3 years when it reaches 6-10 feet.

Boas will roll into a ball to protect themselves when frightened or threatened. They defend themselves as other snakes' do, by striking—that is, by throwing their heads and the front part of their bodies at the enemy. Their teeth can make serious wounds because they point inward. When threatened, a boa will hiss and strike. Although carrying no poison, a bite can be painful. Like many other large snakes, they are killed for their skins, which are highly prized in the leather trade. These

snakes are not farmed for their skins, and collecting them from the wild has caused population declines. Boas are also consumed by indigenous people and collected for the pet trade. They have long been popular as pets because of their large size and relatively calm demeanor. The boa constrictor is nominally protected by the Appendices to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES), with the intention of controlling international trade.

Man is the adult boa constrictors only enemy, with the biggest threat being the ever-increasing human populations and the loss of prime habitat. Young Boa Constrictors are preyed upon by a large variety of forest-dwelling animals such as coatis, hawks, caimans, and wild pigs. In many parts of its range, the Boa Constrictor is considered a pest and is



killed by farmers because it kills their chickens. It is believed that the snake kills other types of livestock as well. Boas are very important in controlling rodent populations which, when in excess, can have a seriously negative impact on the environment. In some parts of South America Boas are kept as house-snakes where they help by controlling rodent infestation.

Bacalar Chico serves as the principal Belizean nesting area for Loggerhead and Green Turtles.

As one of Belize's newest preserves, the park is accessible only by sea from points on Ambergris Caye, Sarteneja and elsewhere on the mainland off the Bay of Chetumal. The Mexican port town of X'calak, only about twenty-five minutes away by boat, can also quickly transport visitors. Explore the diverse underworld as well on a dive. Tours to Bacalar Chico can be arranged through local tour guides. Dress lightly; wear a bathing suit, repellant and/or sunscreen, comfortable shoes or sandals, sunglasses and a hat.
